5. goSafe Program update and feedback

Nicole Arsenault presented a summary of the goSafe program in the context of the METRAC review and highlighted a holistic perspective on the program including some of the challenges and the feedback she has received on the program.

Multiple perspectives were shared about goSafe in its current design and some of the challenges going forward with the program. Some of the perspectives included:

- Appreciation was expressed for the goSafe program and the consultative and continuous improvement approach engaged in by the staff
- Economic and resource considerations for example: how do we allocate the safety budget between competing priorities? How much tuition money gets allocated to safety vs. academic consideration? How do we allocate across an ever-expanding wish list of safety initiatives?
- Boundaries of York University for safety issues for example: how many safety-related initiatives should be started in the Village? What about the new developments planned for north end of the campus when subway comes in? Which safety initiatives are the responsibilities of the university, which are responsibilities of the local community and students living in the community and which are responsibilities of local police and city councilors etc.? Another question is should students have door to door service in the Village?
- Safety of goSafe Staff: Since goSafe staff are also York students, their needs for safety must also be taken into consideration

 Purposes of goSafe: Questions were raised about whether goSafe is designed to address academic priorities around safety (e.g. transportation for students working late in the library) or social (e.g. transportation of students from local clubs).

6. Security Statistics on the Website - Feedback

Rob Castle reviewed the security statistics. Attention must be paid to the presentation of the information keeping in mind implications for recruitment of students as well as needs to be transparent. Statistics need to be reviewed and brought back to council.
